NONCREDIT CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION

The NONCREDIT CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION is based on hours of instruction rather than on credit. The Noncredit Certificate of Completion was created in response to Senate Bill 361 (SB 361), which encourages California Community Colleges to offer certificates leading to improved employability or job opportunities.

Courses leading to a Noncredit Certificate of Completion are in the area of Career Development or College Preparation and must be part of one of the following: (1) a short-term vocational program with high employment potential; (2) a sequence of courses in (A) elementary or secondary basic skills including sequences of
